

Capilano Suspension Bridge

Once a local ski hill, Grouse Mountain has developed into a year-round mountain recreation park that claims to be the number-one attraction in Vancouver. The Skyride gondola transports you to the mountain's 1,110m (3,642-ft.) summit. On a clear

day, the view from the top is the best around: you can see the city and the entire lower mainland, from far up the Fraser Valley

Friday Morning Speaker Randall M. Tietjen

Randall Tietjen is a partner in the Minneapolis office of the law firm of Robins, Kaplan, Miller & Ciresi L.L.P., where he has been practicing law for 20+ years. He practices mainly in the areas of business and intellectual-property litigation. He is a graduate of the University of Minnesota (B.A.) and

William Mitchell College of Law (J.D.), where he was editor-in-chief of the law review. After law school, he clerked for Judge C. Arlen Beam on the United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit, in Lincoln, Nebraska. His book "In the Clutches of the Law: Clarence Darrow's Letters" was published in June 2013 by the University of California Press. The book has been lauded by reviewers. Bryan A. Garner—the editor in chief of "Black's Law Dictionary" and a well-known authority on writing—called it the "best law-related book to have appeared in 2013."

Charlotte Gill is the Canadian author of the short story collection *Ladykiller*, a finalist for the Governor General's Literary Award for fiction and winner of the Danuta Gleed Award and the B.C. Book Prize for fiction. Her work has appeared in *Best Canadian Stories*, *The Journey Prize Stories*, and many magazines. She lives on the Sunshine Coast of British Columbia.

Eating Dirt is an extended postcard from the cut blocks—a vivid portrayal of one woman's life planting trees. This literary journey follows tree planters through a year on the job, through bugs and bears, remote camps and logging towns. It offers a glimpse into the unique subculture of those who work at one of the dirtiest jobs left on earth among the world's last giant trees. The story also traces the seasons of the forest and the remarkable life cycles of trees.

Charlotte spent seventeen years working in the forests of Canada. During her career, she encountered hundreds of clear-cuts, each one a collision site between human civilization and the natural world, a complicated landscape presenting geographic evidence of our appetites. Charged with sowing the new forest in these clear-cuts, tree planters are a tribe caught between the stumps and the virgin timber, between environmentalists and loggers.
