A lawsuit filed by Patrick McCarthy related to an onthe-job injury turned into what is believed to be the longest civil case in Hamilton County history.

McCarthy was injured when a manway cover from a rail car carrying chemicals blew off.
McCarthy and his attorneys;
Stan Chesley, Joe Deters and
Bill Markovits, asked a Hamilton
County jury to award him \$62
million.

Common Pleas Judge William Mallory presided over the case. The jury concluded there was no negligence on the part of the defendants and McCarthy was awarded nothing.

Fred Raschke from Mills Shirley of Galveston, Texas served as cocounsel to the defense.
