As an assistant attorney general with the Ohio Organized Crime Investigations Commission and staff attorney for the Ohio Attorney General's Heroin Unit, assisting Federal, State, and local law enforcement agencies with the investigation and prosecution of large scale drug trafficking operations and combatting Ohio's opioid epidemic. Henrique also served as pension counsel for the Ohio state retirement systems, five large multibillion dollar institutional investors, representing and advising the pensions in state and federal litigation, compliance, legislative initiatives and matters arising under Ohio's sunshine laws.
